



Birds are a major prey to Monarch Butterflies. They are easily able to pry open the bodies of the butterflies and are even capable of eating around the areas that may be harmful to them. Galbulidae ruficauda, or the Jacamar bird, is a common threat to Monarchs that mostly resides in Mexico, Central America, and South America. They are most commonly a threat when Monarchs migrate to the south for the winter.
